





Modern Slavery: What it is?

WHAT

Modern slavery is a recent term with no globally agreed definitions. It is an umbrella term encompassing a range of exploitative practices of other people for commercial gains.

WHO

Modern slavery conditions can be imposed to adults and children, by State authorities, by private enterprises or

by State authorities, by private enterprises or by individuals.







SCOPE

There are some forms of modern slavery not related to private economy activities, such as forced marriage. Others exist in private economies workforces, such as forced labor, human trafficking, etc.





WHERE


Modern slavery can happen anywhere in the world. Private enterprises can have potential modern slavery risks in their own operations and/or in their supply chains.






Modern Slavery: Facts & Figures

Deforestation

Some major drivers



- Land conversion for agriculture (agricultural expansion)
- Mining projects
- Land for settlements
- Implementation of infrastructure projects e.g construction of roads
- Poor forest management (unsustainable harvesting of fuel food; illegal logging)
- Forest fires

Earth loses 10 million hectares of forests/yr (equal to 27 soccer fields/min)!

Some major impacts



- Disrupted water cycle
- Soil erosion
- Contributing factor to climate change due to a severely impacted carbon cycle (decreased in carbon storage/sink along with release in CO2 during deforestation)
- Loss of species due to loss of habitats
- Increase outbreaks of new and emerging diseases
- Rise in extreme weather events

Extractive Industries: An Opportunity To Accelerate Momentum

More than

090%

of biodiversity loss is driven by the extraction and processing of natural resources, which are key inputs to global value chains. Although many companies have made progress on climate action, they are lagging far behind on tackling biodiversity loss.

According to EcoVadis data,



of companies in high-risk extractive industries had policies on biodiversity in 2023 (up from 13% in 2022).

By contrast, corporate policies on climate change are much more common, with

40%

of companies having one in place in 2023 (37% in 2022). The good news is that policy setting on both topics has steadily increased over the past year, indicating that businesses are beginning to recognize the twin crises as equal threats.

About the German Act on Corporate Due Diligence Obligations in Supply Chains (LkSG)





Adopted on 11 June 2021

Protection of human rights (human rights violations and damage to the environment) in supply chains through risk management & reporting requirements



Concerned:

Companies based in Germany (incl. foreign companies with sites or subsidiaries) with 3,000+ employees (in Germany) from Jan 1st 2023 (1,000+ from Jan 1st 2024)





Scope

- Own operations
- Direct suppliers
- Indirect suppliers if suspected violation of a human rights-related or an environment-related obligation (substantiated knowledge)



Requirements:







- Fines, : periodic penalty payments of up to EUR 50,000 in administrative enforcement proceedings and/or fines. Fines up to EUR 8 million. If average annual turnover is more than EUR 400 million, up to 2% of the average annual turnover.
- Exclusion from public tenders for up to three years
- Civil liability: person claiming to be victim of a violation of a "paramount protected legal position" may authorise trade unions and NGOs to bring proceedings to enforce that person's rights in their own capacity ("special transfer of procedural authority"; LkSG extends rights of domestic trade unions and NGOs regarding assertion of third party rights violations in front of German courts)





HuRi: What is, Why is it important & How to protect it!



What are HuRi?

- The basic rights and freedoms that belong to every person in the world, regardless of their nationality, race, gender, religion, or any other status.
- The right to life, liberty, security, dignity, equality, non-discrimination, fair treatment, privacy, health, education, work, and remedy.



Why are HuRi important for suppliers?

- Teva requires you to respect and protect human rights in your own operations and in your supply chain.
- A growing external demand to avoid cause or contribute to adverse human rights impacts, and to address them when they occur.



How to respect and protect HuRi in your supply chain?

Conduct human rights due diligence:

- Identify the HURi risks and impacts in your supply chain
- **Assess** the severity and likelihood of the risks & priorities for action
- Prevent and mitigate by taking effective measures to avoid, reduce or remedy
- Account by being transparent and communicating your performances


Supply Chain Due Diligence: Navigating the Regulation Maze and Beyond

Sustainability considerations, including environmental, social and governance (ESG) factors, are now at the center stage of policymaking. And national and regional laws that companies need to comply with are becoming increasingly stricter. For those operating under multiple jurisdictions, the task is potentially more difficult, as, despite many similarities, there are also significant differences between them. But even companies operating in countries with no specific sustainability-related regulations are likely to be affected – if their customers or trading partners are based in countries with strict due diligence laws, it's likely they also have to comply with those requirements. So the best course of action is to understand the key requirements driven by specific regulations and adopt a recognized solution that will tackle them holistically.

German Supply Chain Act (LkSG): Key Highlights

Applicable to companies operating in Germany with more than 3,000 employees (as of 2024, lowering the threshold to 1,000). Business that are part of the supply chains of those companies (directly, or in Tier 2 or more in some industries) will likely be required to respond to their ESG disclosure requests.

The German Supply Chain Act or *Lieferkettensorgfaltspflichtengesetz* (LkSG) aims to protect human rights and limit environmental harm by making it mandatory for companies in the scope noted above to conduct supply chain due diligence. LkSG mandates organizations to conduct risk identification and management, due diligence activities, and mitigation actions, as well as publish annual reports. Non-compliance can be costly, with penalties and fines ranging up to 2% of the company's annual turnover.
